






COVID UPDATE



Struggling with Tax Bills?

Seniors Invited to Defer Property Taxes

Qualified senior citizens, aged 65 years and older are invited to apply for Senior Citizen Real Estate Tax Deferral Program. The program allows participants to defer property tax payments until the property is sold. The deferral is treated as a loan and accrues 6 percent simple interest until paid. To qualify, the applicant's household income cannot exceed \$55,000. Additionally, the property must be used exclusively for residential purposes.
